ROWAN'S LAW

This is an **URGENT** update regarding the legislative requirements under the implementation of Rowan's Law by the Government of Ontario.

All Registrants and Team Officials must have reviewed and signed the acknowledgement form before they are permitted on the ice this season!!

What is Rowan's Law?

Rowan Stringer was a 17-year old Ottawa varsity rugby player who died from sustaining multiple concussions resulting in a catastrophic swelling of the brain – second impact syndrome. On March 7, 2018, Ontario passed Rowan's Law (Concussion Safety), 2018 and related amendments to the Education Act. However, it is important to understand that this applies to all Sport Organizations, schools, programs and businesses in the province. This is not a hockey 'thing' – it is legislation (Ontario Regulation 161/19) from the Government of Ontario.

All Registrants registering July 1, 2019 or after must have completed the review information and acknowledgement prior to registration/participation.

All Team Officials currently registered will be required to complete the review of information and acknowledgement prior to August 30, 3019.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

With the 2018/19 season about to begin, we have been working hard to develop a plan for players and coaches.

For player development this year AMHA has contracted North Ice Hockey to continue with developing AMHA players. North Ice will be providing 4 development sessions to all players and Goalies from Novice to Bantam. Players will continue to work on the most important fundamental in hockey "Skating". The players will work on proper posture, strides, and edges. Although some of this may seem repetitious we must remember that it takes years of training to perfect each skill. North Ice will also have a goalie instructor out at all the sessions to help improve our goalies angling, and movement in the crease. It is mandatory that the coaching staff is on the ice for these sessions to help correct players and work with North Ice. This is also a learning opportunity for coaching staff to hear the key messages that is being conveyed to the players so that we as a coaching group can continue to repeat the same messages in our player development plans.

This year AMHA will continue to provide our coaching staff with the opportunity to learn from some of the industry professionals. Brantford Minor Hockey has been kind enough to extend invitations out to surrounding hockey associations to attend coaching seminars at their facilities at no cost. The first session in Brantford has been booked September 5th and the email has been distributed to our coaches, these sessions go towards maintenance points for coaches to maintain their certifications. AMHA will also be hosting 1-2 coaching seminars this year that will be used to talk about effective coaching techniques/tools the first session will be in early September.

Looking forward to a great season of hockey!!

Tryouts

AE Tryouts start on Friday, September 6th and are to be completed on or around Sunday, September 15th.

If your child participated in the Rep tryouts last spring, no additional tryout fee is applicable. For those who did not try out for Rep, a \$40.00 tryout fee is required as well as the completion of the Rowan's Law acknowledgment form found on the website.

Tryout Expectations:

Going out onto the ice and giving instructors 100% respect and effort.

Please note that coaches have been directed to not provide parents or players with any individual's updates throughout the tryout process. Players and parents are asked not to engage the coaches or designated instructors for such feedback. <u>Regular season</u> for Southern Counties (Rep & AE teams) will start on as early as Monday September 30th, 2019. You may not know whom you are playing until 48 hours prior but you will definitely be playing so be prepared.

Regular Season for Grand River Local League will start the week of October 7^{th}

Please note that Local League evaluations will start up on September 15th. Ice times are posted on the Ayr Minor Hockey website

Practices

Every team will be given a minimum of one hour of practice per week. You will have a normal practice time during the week but from time to time there may be some movement to reflect conflicts with out of town games or if another team needs to be moved and accommodated. There will be plenty of notice for all of this. During OMHA play downs, Southern County playoffs and Grand River Local League playoffs, you may only have a week or two notice so I would encourage checking the website often during this time. If you want to switch practices with another team, I am fine with this but you must notify me as soon as possible so I can update the Township of North Dumfries.

Game Time Policy

Please ensure that your team is at the rink at least 45 minutes prior to game time. Ice time is extremely tight this year and it is vital that we start on time or if the situation presents itself, we'd like to start early to avoid any kind of possibility of a game curfew.

Game Cancellation Policy

In the event of inclement weather, the ice scheduler will let the head coach or team manager via email or by posting a cancellation notice on the website. According to Southern County and Grand River Local League bylaws, only the ice scheduler, The President, Vice President of Hockey or the Rep convener have the authority to cancel the game. Coaches and Managers **DO NOT** have this authority.

Ayr Minor Hockey IP/Minor Novice Program

Season Overview

Hello Hockey parents,

Welcome to the 2019/20 IP and Minor Novice hockey season. Below is brief description that will outline our season objectives based on the implementation guide released by the Ontario Minor Hockey Association (OMHA). The implementation guide can be accessed at <u>here</u>.

Age Groups:

Our IP program will be made up of 2 JR IP teams, ages 4-5(as of December 31st, 2019) and 2 SR IP teams, age 6(as of December 31st, 2019).

Our Minor Novice program is made up of 7(as of December 31st, 2019) year olds.



Schedule for IP and Minor Novice:

Please note that Jr. and Sr. IP and Minor Novice ice times start early this year. Your season starts up on Saturday, September 7th at the North Dumfries Community Centre, Greenfield Road, Ayr.

During the first weeks of ice time, the children will have practices and from there be assigned to teams as communicated by the coaches. From there the group and the schedule for practices can be followed going forward.

Team Uniforms:

Team jerseys and socks will not be handed out until the 3rd or 4th practice of your child's team. The coaches will be using those practices to ensure that teams are divided into fair and even teams. Your child will require her/his own practice jersey and socks for the evaluation process.

Season Objectives:

The focus for our JR IP program is to develop basic hockey skills in a fun and positive environment. Most important is the kids have fun and develop a love for the game of hockey. There will be no games played at the JR IP level against other centers.

Our SR IP program, our association's primary focus is on developing our SR IPs in a fun and positive environment, building on the basic hockey skills learned in JR IP and introducing modified game play. SR IPs will begin playing other centers in February.

Our Minor Novice program, will again build on the hockey skills and passion for the game of hockey learned in the IP program. As a directive, we will maintain a 3 practice to 1 game ratio throughout the season. Minor Novice will begin game play after December 15. The teams are also eligible to enter 3 Jamborees during the course of a season.

As this is a new implementation, there will be many questions and comments. Please feel free to reach out to me by email.
